DIVISIONS – Class List

Classes \$10.00 each

Warm up for Short Stirrup, Pony, Adult Am and Junior "C" Eq from 7am to 8am.

SHORT STIRRUP DIVISION – Open to horses and ponies.

Riders must be 12 and under. Riders showing in this division may not cross enter into any other division other than hack and equitation.

- Class #1 Walk/Trot
- Class#2 Walk/Trot/Canter
- Class #3 Over Fences - Crossrail18"

PONY HUNTER DIVISION – Fences 2'0". Open to ponies ridden by juniors. Individuals are juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Ponies are animals that do not exceed 14.2 hands. Rounds ridden back to back.

- Class #4 Over Fences
- Class #5 Over Fences
- Class #6 Under Saddle

JUNIOR "C" EQUITATION DIVISION – Open to horses and ponies.

Junior "C" Equitation – Riders are classified as Junior "C" such until the end of the calendar year in which they turn twelve (12 and under).

- Class #7 Junior "C" Equitation Over Fences 2'3"
- Class #8 Junior "C" Equitation under Saddle

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER DIVISION – Open to adult amateurs. An amateur does not accept payment for training/showing a horse, for coaching any one to ride, or for acting as an agent in the sale, purchase and/or lease of a horse.

- Class #9 Over Fences 2'3" max
- Class #10 Under Saddle

Warm Up for Junior "A/B"Eq, Junior and Senior Hunter held during Hack.

HACK DIVISION – Open to all horses and ponies. No whips allowed.

- Class #12 Junior Road Hack
- Class #13 Junior Pleasure Hack
- Class #14 Senior Show Hack
- Class #15 Senior Road Hack
- Class #16 Senior Pleasure Hack

JUNIOR "A/B" EQUITATION DIVISION – Open to horses and ponies.

Combined Junior "A/B" Equitation – Rider are classified as Junior "A/B" from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 13 to the end of the calendar year in which they turn 18.

- Class #17 Junior "A/B" Equitation Over Fences 2'6"
- Class #18 Junior "A/B" Equitation under Saddle

JUNIOR HUNTER DIVISION – Open to horses and ponies.

- Class #19 Junior Hunter over Fences 2'6"max
- Class #20 Junior Hunter over Fences 2'6"max
- Class #21 Junior Hunter under saddle

SENIOR HUNTER DIVISION – Open to horses.

- Class #22 Senior Hunter over Fences 2'9"max
- Class #23 Senior Hunter over Fences 2'9"max
- Class #24 Senior Hunter under saddle

JUMPER DIVISION – Open to horses and ponies.

- Class #25 Optimum Time (No Jump Off) 2'6" The winning ride must be clean and have a time that is the closest to the time set. **The fastest time does NOT win.**
- Class #26 Table A (Immediate Jump Off) 2'9"
- Class #27 Table A (Immediate Jump Off) 3'0"

Warm Up Ticket – Open schooling for all horses and ponies.

Conditions: All horses wanting to school in the warm-ups must be entered in the show and show numbers must be worn in the ring. Limit of 3 – 5 horses in the ring at a time. Ring may be occupied by multiple trainers. Warm up will be monitored by show management.

No changes or adjustments are to be made to any jump. When you enter the ring, jump one course of 8-9 jumps and then leave the ring. Jumper fences are not to be jumped in warm up.

Due to a tight show schedule, warm-ups will be limited to **five minutes** per group. Competitors must respect the whipper-in when time is called.

There will be no warm up for the Jumper Divisions.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Administration

1. Entries, with payment, must be received on or before the closing date to avoid post entry fees. All shows close the Wednesday prior to the show date.
2. **REFUNDS:** Administration and stall fees are not refundable. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** Class fees will be refunded if cancellation is made in writing and delivered to the show office 24 hours prior to the start of the horse show with the required medical documentation. Once a horse has entered the show grounds, there will be no refund unless authorized by the show committee. **Entry fees for classes cancelled due to unsafe weather conditions will not be refunded.**
3. No numbers will be issued without a signed cheque covering all entry and show fees. Numbers will not be issued to competitors until the entry form has been fully completed.
4. All accounts must be settled prior to the next Quinte Cup show, otherwise entries will be denied.
5. A \$50.00 NSF charge will be added to all accounts paid with cheques that are returned from the bank for any reason.
6. Under NO circumstances will a PHONED IN entry be accepted.

General

7. Current Equine Canada rules will govern all classes.
8. All dogs must be on a leash at all times.
9. In the event of a fall of horse and/or rider, the exhibitor must leave the ring dismounted.
10. Proper show attire, including jackets is required for all divisions and classes. This includes all jumper divisions and warm-up rounds, unless excused by the judge/show management. Half chaps are acceptable in the short stirrup division.
11. Table A Jumper classes will be run under EC Article 238. The use of draw lines is NOT permitted.
12. Approved headgear: Junior competitors must wear proper fitting, approved protective headgear, with the safety harness correctly secured at all times while mounted in competition or on event grounds. Approved headgear must meet the ASTM standards and display the SEI seal.
13. Management reserves the right to limit or close the entries of any class or division in an effort to adhere to the timetable.
14. The point system for Year End Awards is calculated on the basis of one horse/rider combination. To be eligible for the high point trophies in 2009, the same horse/rider combination must compete in at least 3 of the 5 shows.
15. The point system stated in the EC Rules in Article G113 will be used to calculate Quinte Cup Year-End Champions. Where 2 or more combinations have an equal number of points, the winner will be the one with the most number of higher placings.
